Past Simple

Past Simple	Present Perfect Simple	
irregular verbs (see 2nd column of irregular verbs) I spoke	<pre>irregular verbs: form of 'have' + past participle (see 3rd column of irregular verbs) I / you / we / they have spoken he / she / it has spoken</pre>	
regular verbs: infinitive + ed I worked	regular verbs : form of 'have' + infinitive + ed I / you / we / they have worked he / she / it has worked	
Exceptions		
Exceptions when adding 'ed':		
when the final letter is <i>e,</i> only add <i>d</i> love - love <u>d</u>		
after a short, stressed vowel, the final consonant is doubled admit - admi <u>tt</u> ed		
final <i>I</i> is always doubled in British English (not in American English) travel - trave <u>ll</u> ed		
after a consonant, final <i>y</i> becomes <i>i</i> (but: not after a vowel) worry - worr <u>i</u> ed but: play - pla <u>v</u> ed		





Certain time in the past or just / already / yet?

Do you want to express that an action happened at a certain time in the past (even if it was just a few seconds ago) or that an action has *just / already / not yet* happened?

Past Simple	Present Perfect Simple
certain time in the past	just / already / not yet
I phoned Mary 2 minutes ago.	I have just phoned Mary.

Certain event in the past or how often so far?

Do you want to express when a certain action took place or whether / how often an action has happened till now?

Past Simple	Present Perfect Simple	
certain event in the past	whether / how often till now	
He went to Canada last summer.	Have you ever been to Canada? / I have been to Canada twice.	

Emphasis on action or result?

Do you just want to express what happened in the past? Or do you want to emphasise the result (a past action's consequence in the present)?

Past Simple	Present Perfect Simple	
Emphasis on action	Emphasis on result	
I bought a new bike. <i>(just telling what I did in the past.)</i>	I have bought a new bike. (With this sentence I actually want to express that I have a new bike now.)
