Introduction

From my view of the world as a DEAF person, there are four distinct groups of people. To understand this book accurately, you must understand these groups:

DEAF people – those who have a hearing loss, use American Sign Language naturally, and cherish and preserve **DEAF** culture.

Deaf people – those who have a hearing loss, but do not value DEAF people, their language or their culture.

HEARING people – those who are themselves not **DEAF**, but who value **DEAF** people, their language, and their culture.

Hearing people – those who themselves are not DEAF, and who do not value DEAF people, their language, or their culture.

Do you ever wonder why...

in the education of the DEAF we learn the biological terms regarding the human ear such as eardrum, middle ear, inner ear, external auditory meatus, eustachian tube, cochlea, hair cell, and so on, but rarely the terms regarding the human hand and eye?

Does it bother you that...

hearing people desperately rely on telephones, cell phones, car phones, voice response computers, etc. everywhere they go? (They must be handicapped)

Sad but true...

It is expensive to be DEAF but it costs a fortune for the hearing to try to change the DEAF.

Sad but true...

The hearing audience would believe a movie about the deaf done by a hearing filmmaker . . . but if a DEAF filmmaker shows the truth in a movie about the DEAF, the hearing audience ignores the story.

It is a miracle for a DEAF person to talk.

It is a miracle for a hearing person to use ASL fluently.

Do you ever wonder why...

hearing people tend to praise deaf people for their lip-reading skills but rarely praise DEAF people for their signing skills?

the DEAF person's name?

Sad but true...

Deaf people can easily throw away earphones, hearing aids, head phones but cannot throw away cochlear implants.

Just a reminder...

I am DEAF but it does not mean that I am deaf to the hearing world.

Advertisement I would like to see...

Wanted DEAF babysitter for my DEAF child, two years old. Must be able to communicate in ASL only. Good pay.

Just a reminder...

Forbidding DEAF children to use ASL in the classroom is called language abuse.

Sad but true...

The media always mentions lip-reading experts and praises them

... never sign language experts.

Just a question...

Any government agency will listen to hearing parents who are not happy with their DEAF children's communication.

Will the government agency listen to DEAF children who are not happy with their hearing parents' communication?

Concentrate on the DEAF person's auditory problems.

Concentrate on the DEAF person's ability to learn.

OLD DAYS

Hearing people using sign language were called saviors.

NOW-A-DAYS

Hearing people using sign language are called friends.

Just a thought...

Hearing and speaking do not make you smart.

Learning and understanding do.

An equation to ponder...

DEAF perception of the world – eyes

equals

hearing perception of the world – ears

Just a thought...

Removing ASL from a DEAF child is like abortion.

Implanting a hearing device in a DEAF child's ear is invasion.

Don't sign in public.

Use ASL freely in public.

Just a question...

At all hospitals or doctors' waiting rooms there are brochures or flyers advertising hearing aids or Hearing/Speech programs.

Why are there no advertisements on American Sign Language, residential schools, or periodicals about the DEAF?

Sad but true...

Same old story: If one deaf/DEAF driver is in auto accident, hearing people would think ALL should not drive.

Can you understand me in plain English?

Can you understand me in plain ASL?

Notice the differences . . .

DEAF WORLD

"Mother Father hearing" "Mother Father DEAF" "Brother Sister hearing" "Brother Sister DEAF"

HEARING WORLD

"I have a son and he is dea . . . hmm . . . a little bit hard of hearing . . . er, sort of hearing impaired . . .

Just a thought...

It is interesting to see that DEAF people can function in the hearing world very well while hearing people cannot function well in the DEAF world.

Ask the hearing because they know everything.

IN

Ask the DEAF because they know the same as the hearing do.

Just a reminder...

DEAF does not mean being cut off from humanity. Hearing people separate us.
