Czechia and Hungary

Strong points



- Clear structure
- The proposed policy is in accordance with reality
- Mentioning concrete legislation and sources
- A clear description of their position
- Data and impact the pandemic has had on the countries

Czechia and Hungary

Weak points



- The document doesn't look very professional, not very nice visually, it is not aligned correctly, except for the first paragraph
- Czechia has changed its approach to vaccine distribution. Last year, when the epidemiological situation in the Czech Republic was more positive, the country proposed a per-capita vaccination distribution system, this approach changed as the situation got worse and Czechia would benefit more from distribution based on the number of cases.
- According to *Hospodářské noviny*, Czechia ordered only about 80 % of the vaccines it was allowed to order from the EU. Some smaller EU members were able to get more vaccine than Czechia
- Czech Republic lacks in the distribution of the vaccine
- Covid passports are not mentioned, although this is a very important current issue and a very frequent topic which needs further discussion
