Turing machine and programming

Turing complete = can simulate a universal Turing machine.

Turing machine = $\langle Q, \Gamma, b, \Sigma, \delta, q_0, F \rangle$

Q = states

 $\Gamma=$ alphabet of all symbols

b = blank symbol

 $\Sigma = \mathsf{input} \; \mathsf{symbols}$

 $\delta = \text{transition function}$

 q_0 = initial state

F = final state

Kitten

A "concatenative" programming language, i.e. imperative and functional.

- Evaluation programs are evaluation of expressions not execution of orders
- ▶ Immutability once created value does not change
- ▶ Purity function called with same param, always same output

See =Kitten=.

Kitten examples

"meow" say

define greet (List < Char > -> +IO):
   -> name;
   ["Hello, ", name, "!"] concat say
"What is your name? " ask
greet
```

- Polymorphism
- Lambdas
