

Expenditure on prevention

- EU Member States spent €49.9 billion on preventive healthcare in 2020 (the first year of COVID-19). On average, EU spending on prevention accounts for 3.4% of total health spending, or 0.37% of GDP.
- Germany spent €13.9 billion on preventive healthcare, the highest among Member States; it was also the only Member State to spend more than €10 billion.
- Four other Member States spent more than €3.0 billion on preventive healthcare in 2020, Italy (€8.7 billion), France (€8.0 billion), the Netherlands (€4.1 billion) and Spain (€3.8 billion).
- At the other end of the ranking, Cyprus (€28.9 million) and Malta (€20.5 million) recorded the lowest values in the EU.
- The Czech Republic spent EUR 747 million



Hospital beds (2005 - 2019)


Inpatient care beds/1000 inhabitants (2005 et 2019)

Average length of hospital stay in selected countries in 2000 and 2019





Potential:


- Improve health status (especially for certain population groups)

Changing the paternalistic concept of the doctor-patient relationship

- An attempt to establish greater symmetry.
- The patient actively participates in the therapeutic process.
- Doctor and patient are partners whose common interest is the management of the patient's illness.
- The physician does not impose his/her opinions and beliefs on the patient, but is the patient's advisor in the process of making decisions about treatment and its course.
