
## Economic co-operation


- The EU imported goods worth 519 billion Euros from China in 2023
- EU goods exports to China accounted for 223 billion Euros in 2023
- The EU had a trade deficit of 292 billion Euros with China in 2023
- Bilateral trade has increased significantly in recent decades
- The EU imports Chinese products such as telecommunications equipment, electrical machinery and apparatus, and automatic data-processing machines.
- China imports EU goods like motor cars and vehicles, medicaments, and other machinery.




EU imports of goods, 2002 and 2023

# Tarifs and free trade

The average tariff on Chinese goods levied by the EU is about 5%

The average tariff on EU goods levied by China is about 10%

The EU has also imposed tariffs on Chinese Electric Vehicles since the 30th October 2024. The tariffs range from 17%-35.3%.

The reason for these tariffs are unfair subsidies by the Chinese government which violate WTO guidelines.

# De-risking or de-coupling?

With rising geopolitical tensions, the EU has tried to reduced its reliance on China

De-risking aims to "manage risks coming from economic and technological engagement with China." (European Parliament, p. viii)

De-coupling means the severing of economic ties

The EU has adopted a de-risking strategy in recent years, but if the US pursue their tariff policy against China and the EU, both will likely intensify trade
