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# Summary of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> declension

## Review

- Nouns from the 4<sup>th</sup> declension have Gen. Sg. ending -us, while nouns from the 5<sup>th</sup> declension have Gen. Sg. -ei.
- There are two paradigms in the 4<sup>th</sup> declension: *status* and *genu*:
  - *status* apply to masculines (and one feminine *manus*),
  - *genu* covers neuters (only words *genu* and *cornu*).
- 5<sup>th</sup> declension has only one paradigm: *facies*, corresponding words are usually feminines.

# Complete paradigm of the 4<sup>th</sup> declension

	Singular		Plural	
	masculines	neuters	masculines	neuters
Nom.	stat -us	gen -u	stat -us	gen -ua
Gen.	stat -us	gen -us	stat -uum	gen -uum
Acc.	stat -um	gen -u	stat -us	gen -ua
Abl.	stat -u	gen -u	stat -ibus	gen -ibus

#### Comments

- Note that a lot of endings in *genu* are similar. It may cause problems in tasks like "give the opposite number".
- Pronunciation of genitive plural requires double "uu".
- All the neutrals end in Nom. and Acc. in Pl. with -a.

# Complete paradigm of the 5<sup>th</sup> declension

	Singular	Plural
Nom.	faci -es	faci-es
Gen.	faci -ei	faci -erum
Acc.	faci -em	faci-es
Abl.	faci -e	faci -ebus

### Examples

• Compare 4<sup>th</sup> decl. noun connected with an adjectives from 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> decl.:

status bonusstatusstatus bonistatuustatum bonumstatusstatu bonostatibu

status boni statuum bonorum status bonos statibus bonis • Similarly a neuter from  $4^{th}$  decl. with an adjective:

genu laesum	genua laesa
genus laesi	genuum laesorum
genu laesum	genus laesa
genu laeso	genibus laesis

• And an example from the  $5^{th}$  declension:

caries sicca	caries siccae
cariei siccae	carierum siccarum
cariem siccam	caries siccae
carie sicca	cariebus siccis

### Vocabulary

There is small addition to your vocabulary of the 4<sup>th</sup> declension. No new vocabulary is added to the 5<sup>th</sup> declension.
