




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- The EU can generate better conditions for loans, stimuluses, grants. Sharing

- Next Generation EU is 750 billion temporary recovery instrument to help repair the immediate economic and social damage brought about by the coronavirus pandemic
- The EU can borrow on the markets at more favourable rates than many Member States and redistribute the amounts
