Question 1: (Icebreaker)

In terms of percentage, how likely do you believe it is that a Nuclear Weapon will be used as a result of the War in Ukraine?

Ouestion 2:

Currently, do you consider Putin and his war in Ukraine the biggest threat to the global nuclear order?

Follow up: Do you believe any tenets of the global order (I refer to deterrence, arms control, non-proliferation, and disarmament) to be at greater risk than the others?

Question 3: Russia has had little regard for the rules and norms of the international order throughout their invasion of Ukraine, how is their treatment and view of the global nuclear order different?

Follow up: would you view Russia's reckless attacks on and around civilian nuclear facilities in Ukraine (Chernobyl, Zaphorizia) indicative of their attitude towards the use of Nuclear weapons? Is this how they get their foot in the door, or perhaps thow they test the international response?

Question 4: You wrote in your article 'The War in Ukraine and Global Nuclear Order': "The Ukraine conflict has virtually frozen all diplomacy between Washington and Moscow", with the START treaty expiring in 2026, how do you anticipate nuclear bilateral negotiations and relations between the U.S. and Russia will unfold in the coming years?

Question 5: Despite undoubtedly damaging, severely, the post-war European and the global nuclear taboo, do you think that renewed public awareness and even perhaps fear of nuclear annihilation may result in a net-stronger nuclear taboo and global order?
