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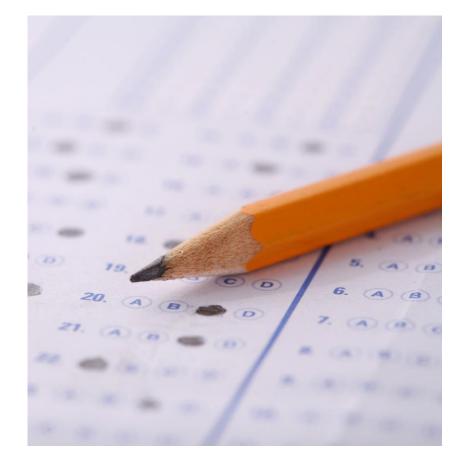

## Form of teaching

 The course is taught offline.\* However, some lectures/seminar will be online – it is clearly indicated in the course schedule.

### Aim

To understand the most important issues connected with the organisation of health systems.

To know the basic health system types and to understand and discuss their strengths and weaknesses.

To understand and discuss selected health policy problems/agendas and proposals for solutions.

# Organization of the course

In the course, lectures are completed by seminars, reading activities and discussions – see <a href="the-see-">the schedule</a>.



## Requirements

- **Comparative health system Activity** Students are required 1) to participate in a reading activity, 2) to prepare an overview of health system and 3) to have a presentation (in teams).
- The Health Care System Profile through the Lens of Human Resources Activity Students are required to develop, in teams, a semester project.
- Reviews Students are required to write a review of a peer's assigned project.

#### Nota bene

- Description of all activities is in Course Syllabus.
- Detailed information about all activities will be available in Moodle in suitable week.
- All activities outcomes have to be uploaded to Moodle in the deadline given by the teacher (deadlines will be in Moodle). Students are supposed to meet these deadlines. Later submission will not be accepted and will result in student's failing the class.
- All students are required to participate in all activities.

## Health Systems Opening

#### Key terms

The health system comprises all organizations, institutions and resources that produce actions whose primary purpose is to improve health (WHO, 2000).

The prevention, treatment, and management of illness and the preservation of mental and physical well-being through the services offered by the medical and allied health professions (CDC).

Health is a state of complete physical and mental well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity (WHO, 1948)

Health System Healthcare Health

#### and ...

The health care system refers to the institutions, people and resources involved in delivering health care to individuals.

Health is a multifaceted concept and not easily measurable.

Refer to peoples' health status (how healthy they are).

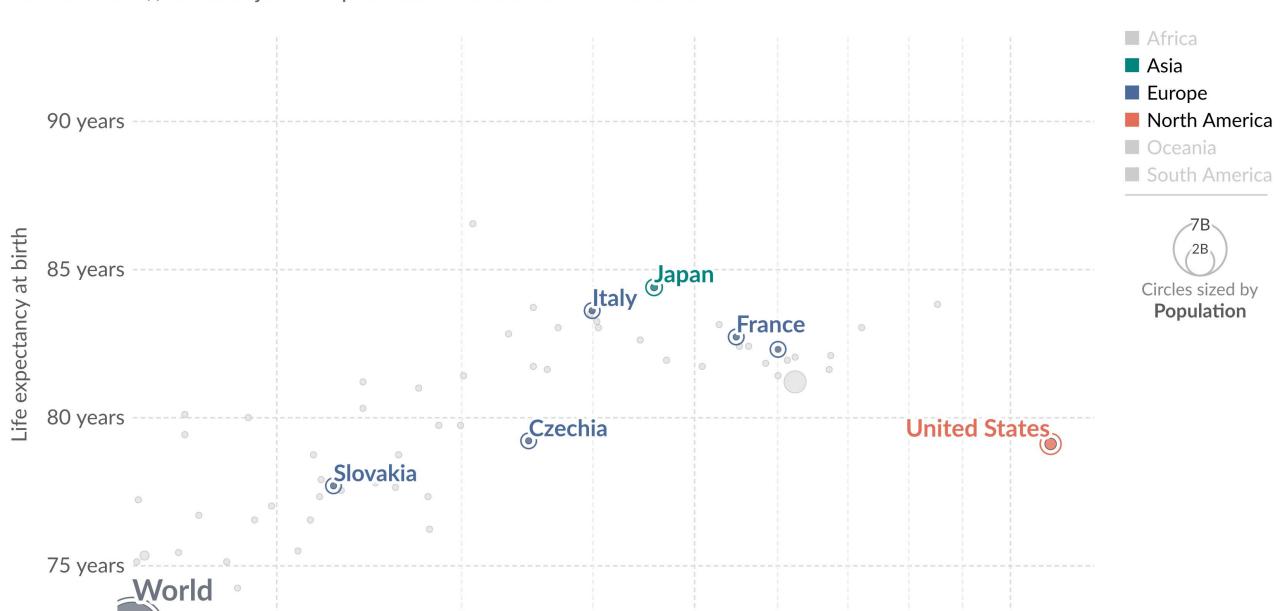

#### Life expectancy vs. healthcare expenditure, 2019



The period life expectancy<sup>1</sup> at birth, in a given year. Healthcare expenditure per capita is measured in current international-\$, which adjusts for price differences between countries.

Key health indicators

Life expectancy

 People around the world are living longer and healthier lives

 Life expectancy and healthy life expectancy have increased, but unequally.

"Life expectancy and healthy life expectancy (HALE) have both increased by over 8% globally between 2000 and 2016, and remain profoundly influenced by income. Despite the largest gains in both indicators being due primarily to the progress made in reducing child mortality and fighting infectious diseases, low-income and lower-middleincome countries continue to suffer from the poorest overall health outcomes, lagging far behind the global

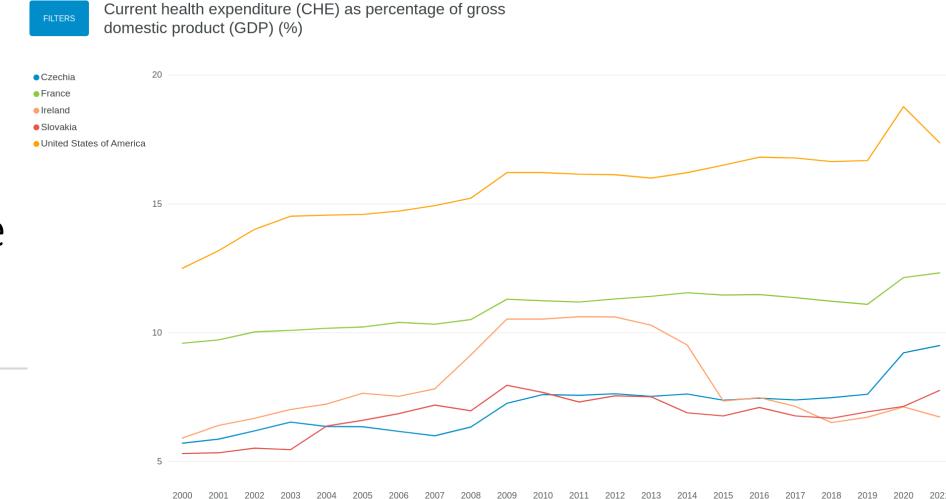

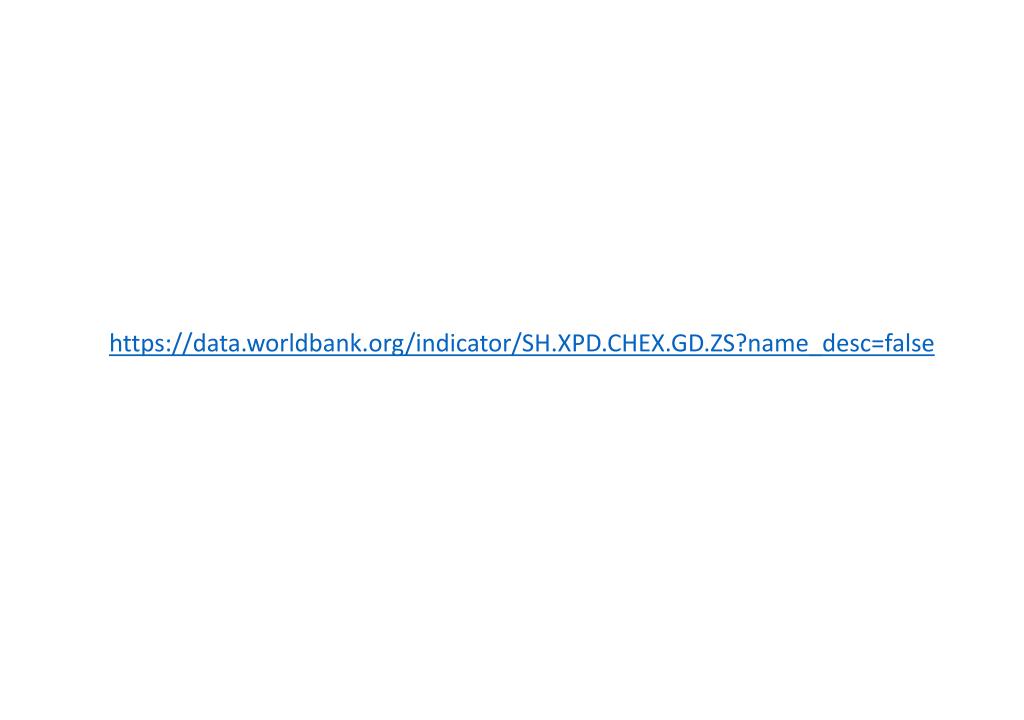
World Health Statistic 2021 (visual summary)

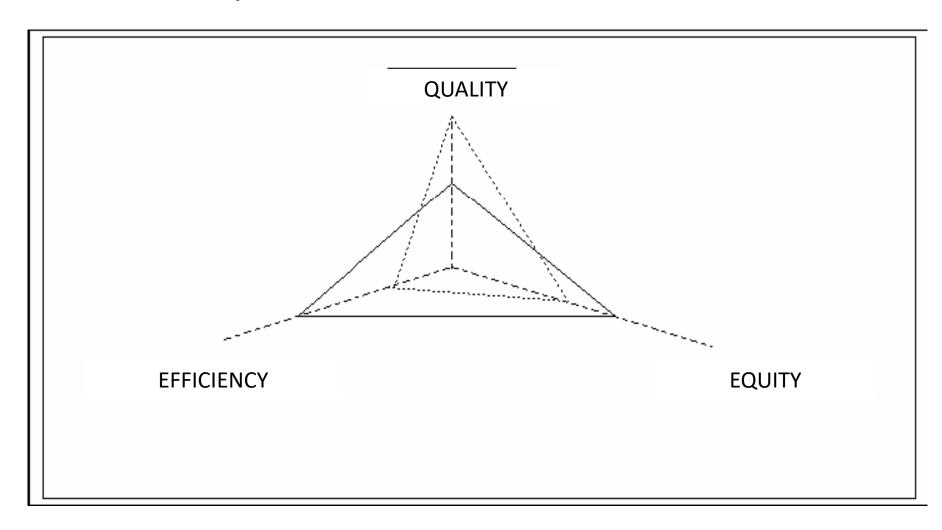
