Overview of my health system

In this activity, you will use the knowledge gained from the assigned readings (commentary) to introduce the healthcare system in your country. Each team of three students has to select one healthcare system (according to one country) and mention the differences/similarities with the other two countries. You can obtain up to 15 points for this activity.

Parts of the overview:

1. Introduction to the health system:

The overview must include:

- basic characteristics of the health system in your country,
- identification of key actors,
- main health indicators,
- information about access to healthcare in your country,
- financing of the system,
- health policy developments (various reforms) and
- strengths and weaknesses of the system
- differences and similarities with the other two countries.

The overview can include any other indicators, sources, or data you consider relevant and important.

You can use any of the State of Health in the EU profiles for inspiration.

2. Classification of the health system:

Apply the selected classification of health systems you have learned about in the readings to the health system in your country. Compare with other classifications you have been introduced to in your reading. Discuss.

This activity is designed to encourage critical thinking and the application of theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios. Feel free to include additional sources or data to increase the depth of your analysis.
