## Terrorism


• What, in your understanding, constitutes acts of terrorism?

- "One man's terrorist is another man's freedom fighter"
- Lack of globally agreed upon definition of terrorism
- Most common elements of various definitions:
  - Political demands
  - Targeting civilians
  - Aims to produce fear
  - Non-state actors

#### Causes of death in the US



What Americans die from, what they search on Google, and what the media reports on

Causes of death data refers to 2016; Google search data averaged over the period from 2004 to 2016; and NYT and Guardian data from 1999 to 2016.
Not all causes of death are shown: Shown is the data on the ten leading causes of death in the United States plus drug overdoses, homicides and terrorism.
All values are normalized to 100% so they represent their relative share of the top causes, rather than absolute counts (e.g. 'deaths' represents each causes' share of deaths within the 13 categories shown rather than total deaths). The causes of death shown here account for approximately 88% of total deaths in the United States in 2016.

## Critical Terrorism Studies (CTS)

• CTS: "a research orientation that is willing to challenge dominant knowledge and understanding of terrorism, is sensitive to the politics of labelling in the terrorism field, is transparent about its own values and political standpoints, adheres to a set of responsible research ethics, and is committed to a broadly defined notion of emancipation." (Smyth et al. 2008, pp. 2)








## Emergence of suicide attacks

- First Palestinian suicide attack was carried out in 1989 by Palestinian Islamic Jihad
- Suicide attacks continued sporadically during the 1990s, conducted by Islamist groups
- The peak: second intifada

### Second Intifada







- Which organizations carried out suicide attacks from September September 2000 through August 2005? (Benmelech and Berrebi 2007)
  - 39.9 percent by Hamas
  - 26.4 percent by Fatah
  - 25.7 percent by the Palestinian Islamic Jihad (PIJ)
  - 5.4 percent by the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP)
  - 2.7 percent by other organizations



















### "Intifada of knives"

- Between 1 October 2015 and 1 October 2016:
  - 166 stabbing attacks
  - 89 attempted stabbings
  - 108 shootings
  - 47 vehicular attacks
  - 1 vehicle bus bombing

#### Israelis and Palestinians Killed in the Current Violence



This chart shows how many Palestinians have been killed by Israelis (red bar) and how many Israelis have been killed by Palestinians (blue bar) each year since the Second Intifada began on September 28, 2000. In total, at least 9,600 Palestinians and 1,251 Israelis have been killed.
